PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York:

The petition of John Kautz hereby filed, respectfully showeth:

First. My place of residence is 1471 - 2nd Av., New York City, N. Y.

Second. My occupation is electrician (Give number and street)

Third. I was born on the 23 day of June, anno Domini 1896, at Budapest Hungary

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Bremen, on or about the 1 day of Oct

anno Domini 1905, and arrived in the United States, at the port of NY, on the 10 day of Oct

anno Domini 1905, on the vessel Unknown (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 11 day of Mar, anno Domini 1925

at NY, in the USD Court of SD of NY

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Elizabeth; she was born on the 11 day of Apr, anno Domini 1897

at Hungary, and now resides at _____ with me (Give number, street, city or town, and State)

I have 5 children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Present Gov't of Hungary, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 10 day of Oct, anno Domini 1905, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 1 day of May, anno Domini 1919, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____ at _____, on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 1_____, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: _____, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
